# **Literacy Matters**

Children of parents with low literacy skills have a 72 percent chance of being at the lowest reading levels themselves.

The value to our economy in additional wages and the reduction in costs for various support programs is estimated at more than \$200 billion a year. Of adults with the lowest literacy levels, 43 percent live in poverty, and 70% of adult welfare recipients have low literacy levels.

Low literacy costs the U.S. at least \$225 billion each year in nonproductivity in the workforce, crime, and loss of tax revenue due to unemployment. Of all adults in the US with the lowest levels of English literacy, 34% are immigrants.

Seventy-five percent of state prison inmates did not complete high school or can be classified as low literate.
